

Summer on the Blue Mountains Trail

With the start and spread of the <u>Elbow Creek Fire</u> near Troy, the Umatilla National Forest was closed indefinitely starting July 16. This means Section 3 and much of Section 6 of the Blue Mountains Trail cannot be accessed while this closure is in effect, but other trail sections outside of the Umatilla National Forest remain open. We will continue to monitor the fires and access information from the Umatilla National Forest, and we will post updates on our <u>Facebook page</u>.

Prior to the closure, we shared a summer Blue Mountains Trail update on our blog. While the best weather conditions to start a thru-hike generally arrive in September, this is a great time to plan some section hikes. We have begun to mark some of the more challenging cross country routes and will be in the field for much of the next month to help clarify route-finding and make other improvements.
