

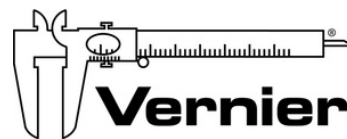


Support Conservation, Recreation, and Stewardship in the Greater Hells Canyon Region

We work with businesses of all sizes to tailor a program that matches giving ability with impact. Join these great brands and businesses by partnering with Greater Hells Canyon Council today!





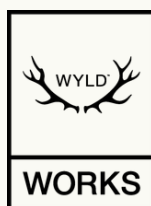
For the past 5 years, **Minimal Gear** has **partnered with GHCC to commemorate Earth Day** with a special activation to their customers, providing a call to action with information about our work, a week long sale, and up to 20% of all sales during the promotion donated to GHCC to support our general conservation work and development of the Blue Mountains Trail.



When Jeanne and David Williamson, owners of Evermine Labels, moved their production facility from Portland to La Grande, they made an immediate impact in the community, revitalizing a downtown block and opening **The Press Room, a coffee shop that also serves as the community hub for the Blue Mountains Trail**. In addition to providing this space in La Grande, Evermine has supported GHCC with donated printing and generous financial support.

For decades, **OARS** has **generously supported Greater Hells Canyon Council** through a mix of auction donations, direct financial contributions, and fundraising from guests on their guided rafting trips on the Snake River through Hells Canyon and on the Mainstem Salmon River.

Each year, OARS donates seats for two guests on a rafting trip, the top package in our live auction at our annual Hellraiser fundraiser. In addition, OARS shares our work protecting Hells Canyon with all of their rafting guests, and in doing so, solicits and raises funds that pass through to GHCC.



Wyld, through it's Wyld Works initiative, has generously supported conservation and social justice causes across Oregon. For multiple years, Wyld Works has supported GHCC. **In 2026, a generous grant directly supported the collective work of Camas to Condors**, allowing us to provide the necessary funding to gather tribal and conservation partners to collaborate on Condor reintroduction in Joseph Canyon.



GHCC has a sizable Portland membership, and convening these supporters to keep them engaged in our work is a strategic imperative. GHCC needed a business who was willing to donate a space to host our gatherings. **Migration Brewing stepped in, donating use of their brewpubs across the city** for regular happy hours, small private gatherings, and other community-focused events.
