

Welcome to the summer installment of the Blue Mountains Trail newsletter. We have lots of news to report, from hikers completing a fastest known time, to upcoming work parties and our Fall Gala in La Grande. September is a great season for hiking in the Blues, even with a few fires currently impacting some sections on the trail (see below). We hope to see you soon.

Northeast Oregon Fire Updates

A series of thunderstorms at the end of August started many small fires across the Blue Mountains, and a few of them are impacting some sections of the Blue Mountains Trail.

The <u>Double Creek Fire</u> is currently burning in the Hells Canyon National Recreation Area. Wind and high temperatures are causing this fire to expand rapidly, now over 100,000 acres. It is burning between the Imnaha River and the Western Rim of Hells Canyon. **Hiking Section 2 of the Blue Mountains Trail is not feasible at this time.**

The <u>Crocketts Knob Fire</u> is burning between the Greenhorns summit at Indian Rock and the Middle Fork John Day River. Closure boundaries abut the trail over Vinegar Hill. Contact the Malheur National Forest staff for an update before hiking between Olive Lake and Austin Junction. Upcoming weather will be conducive to firefighting efforts.

Another fire we're paying attention to is the <u>Nebo Fire</u> in the Eagle Cap Wilderness. Although this fire has not closed the trail between the South Fork Imnaha River and Sugarloaf Mountain, it is burning in the vicinity and may continue to grow.
